Program and Research Committee Job Description:

- The Committee shall be responsible for the future organizational and programmatic direction of the Corporation and consider potential new programs and services.
- The Committee shall also review and evaluate from time to time the programs and services provided by the Corporation and be responsible for oversight of the Corporation's delivery of programs and services.
- The Committee shall also assist with the development of policies as needed for accrediting bodies such as Parents Anonymous[®] and Prevent Child Abuse America, etc. or other best practice models.
- Provide oversight to required policy development activities, including the review of the organization's annual 990 prior to its file date; and public policy agenda.

The Committee's FY 2021 Goals:

- 1. Provide oversight of strategic plan, Moving Maryland Forward (FY19-21) in Family Impact & Societal Impact Areas.
- 2. Support the program integration of the Baltimore City Childcare Resource Center at TFT.
- Provide oversight and support to TFT's program evaluation efforts by supporting the efforts of UMB Research Collaborative. The focus this year is the completion of the randomized control trial of Family Connects Maryland at Sinai Hospital.
- 4. Assist in identifying external funding opportunities for program development, improvement and evaluation.
- 5. Assist in TFT's efforts to disseminate its findings through local, state, national conferences, webinars, and scholarly papers.
- 6. Serve as liaison to community partners and program participants.
- 7. Provide oversight to required policy development activities, including the review of the organization's annual 990 prior to its file date.
- 8. Oversee the Program's Community Advisory Teams, with a focus on Healthy Families.
